# SELECT PRIORITIES: 2025-2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION



### **LOCATION SHIELD ACT**

Rep. Lipper-Garabedian, Rep. Vieira & Sen. Creem

(H.86) An Act to protect - location privacy

(S.197) An Act to protect safety and privacy by stopping the sale of location data

The Location Shield Act would prohibit companies from selling, trading, or renting your location information. And it would ensure that companies collect and use your location data only with your permission. Continuing to allow such sensitive personal data to be recklessly sold on the open market enables bad actors to exploit it to attack people online and in person. The Location Shield Act will protect domestic abuse victims, abortion patients, trans people and their families, doctors, nurses, journalists, and all Massachusetts residents.

### **DIGNITY NOT DEPORTATIONS ACT**

Rep. Barber, Rep. Dave Rogers & Sen. Gomez

(H.1588 | S.1122 ) An Act relative to immigration detention and collaboration agreements

Our state cannot change federal immigration policy, but we do not have to contribute to its increasing cruelty. To carry out mass deportations, the federal government has made clear it will seek to dramatically increase immigration detention and deportation. The Dignity Not Deportations Act would prohibit Massachusetts entities, including sheriffs, from voluntarily renting beds to ICE. And it would prohibit Massachusetts entities from donating time and resources to ICE by signing contracts – such as 287(g) agreements – that deputize local officials as ICE agents.

### **ROAD TO OPPORTUNITY ACT**

Rep. Fluker-Reid & Sen. Cyr

**(H.3662)** An Act to end debt-based driving restrictions and remove economic roadblocks **(S.2368)** An Act to increase opportunity by ending debt-based driving restrictions

Currently, Massachusetts suspends driver's licenses for outstanding fees and administrative fines. The result: tens of thousands of Massachusetts residents are struggling to survive (to get to work, school, doctors, groceries, etc.) because they can't lawfully drive. The Road to Opportunity Act would eliminate license suspension triggers that are **NOT** related to road safety, protecting people experiencing economic hardship from a compounding debt cycle. The bill creates electronic reminders to improve fine and fee collection and allows people to apply for indigency waivers if they cannot afford to pay

### **OVERDOSE PREVENTION**

Rep. Decker, Rep. Lawn & Sen. Cyr

(H.2196 | S.1393) An Act relative to preventing overdose deaths and increasing access to treatment

Overdose prevention centers are a proven, evidence-based way to improve public health and public safety and save lives. This bill would enable harm reduction programs to provide people who use drugs the option to safely consume pre-obtained drugs under supervision of trained health care workers. In addition to preventing deaths, OPCs reduce the transmission of infectious diseases like HIV and hepatitis, and connect patients with social services, including drug treatment and recovery services.
