November's SWAT training took place at Sig Arms Academy in Epping NH. Training for the day consisted of two tracks. Firearms Instructor re-certs / team guals, and barricade tactics. Lt. Vivilo, Operator Dichiara and I conducted MPTC F/A Instructor re-certs on ranges 3 & 4. Team members that are not instructors also qualified with all platforms. The platforms qualified with included pistol, rifle, shotgun, 40 mm less lethal as well as shotgun less lethal. Members of the MSO team joined us for training as well.

Sgt. Fay, Sgt. Max and Operator Saia conducted the second training track at the "Red feather" training location. Sgt. Fay's training report is attached.

Training Scenario 1

Operators were divided into two teams with team leaders and assistant team leaders designated. Operators were given a mission of a search warrant. Team Leaders were provided a Leaders Reconaissance.

Teams gave individual operational briefs.

Upon initiation the team receives simulated weapons fire from target location. Team initiates barricade procedures.

Casualties are designated and the teams must employ evacuation procedures for injured

Teams initiate negotiation procedures and then move to the "gas" option of deploying OC/CS into the target location.

Suspect surrenders and an arrest team moves in to take custody of the suspect.

Training Scenario 2

Operators were divided into two teams with team leaders and assistant team leaders designated. Operators were given a mission of a barricaded person with a firearm. Team Leaders were provided a Leaders Reconaissance.

Teams gave individual operational briefs.

Team begins movement and deploys for barricade procedures.

Upon completing gas procedurs the subject exits the target location.

Target refuses to further comply and begins movement back to target location.

The teams deploy a k-9 in order to deny the suspect entry into the residence. The team deploys an arrest team.

Training Scenario 3

Operators were divided into two teams with team leaders and assistant team leaders designated. Operators were given a mission of a barricaded person with a firearm. Team Leaders were provided a Leaders Reconaissance.

Teams gave individual operational briefs.

Team begins movement and deploys for barricade procedures.

Suspect exits the residence following negotiations armed with a knife. Suspect refuses to be disarmed.

The team deploys a taser/shield team/arrest team. The team initiates a search of the target house utilizing the K-9 in a stack.

The k-9 locates and takes custody of second suspect prior to the arrest team.

Mission Planning, Team Leader, assistant team leader responsibilities

Barricade Procedures

Casualty Collection Point (CCP) Drills

Evacuating casualty from area to the CCP (buddy team)

Gas deployment procedures (masking at 50% security)

Use of 40mm DEFTEC launchers for deploying munitions operationally

Use of the K-9 to deny suspect movement/opportunity

Use of K-9 in the stack for search

Use of K-9 with arrest team


